About the Presenters

Deputy District Judge Grace Chan

Deputy District Judge Grace Chan was admitted as a solicitor of Hong Kong in 1997. She was a deputy special magistrate/deputy magistrate since 1999 and was appointed as a permanent magistrate in 2006. Between 2011-2012, she worked in the District Court as a deputy district judge (general civil) and a master. She has been serving in the Family Court as a deputy judge since November 2012 until now.

Ms. Anna Choi Wan Man, Assistant Professor of Department of Social Work and Social Administration, The University of Hong Kong

Dr. Anna Wai-man CHOI, Assistant Professor, Department of Social Work and Social Administration, The University of Hong Kong: Anna is a Registered Social Worker (RSW), Accredited Family Mediator (HKMAAL) and Specialist (HKCAAVQ). She was previously the center-in-charge of a refuge centre for abused women in Hong Kong. She has tremendous experience in handling family cases and addressing the needs of families with violence. Subsequently, she developed her career in the teaching work of the Department and pursued an academic doctoral degree.

Anna specializes in intimate partner violence and particularly interested in the understanding of the help-seeking behaviors and development of localized strategies for addressing the needs of survivors and promoting their recovery. Recently, Anna obtained the funding to study the women use of force (GRF/RGC 2015-16) and the male victims of intimate partner violence (ECS/RGC 2013-14), and also conducted an evaluation study on children's dispute resolution which was commissioned by the Judiciary in 2013. Over the past ten years, she has been invited to be a trainer in clinical workshops and trainings for social workers in family and crisis services of welfare agencies.

Mr. Patrick Chung Kwok Shing, Mediation Services Coordinator of the Hong Kong Family Welfare Society

Patrick is an experienced accredited family mediation supervisor and has conducted over 500 family mediation cases since 2006. He has extensive experiences in mediation and marital casework, supervision work on mediation and mediation training. He has been the assistant trainer of Family Mediation Training in 2012 and 2013 (accredited by HKIAC) as well as the lead trainer in 2014, 2015 and 2016(accredited by HKMAAL).

He conducted live supervision of Family Mediation for over 49 trainees including lawyers. He has coached Family Mediation Training Courses approved by the HKIAC, HKMAAL and the Law Society of Hong Kong since 2009. He has conducted Family Mediation CPD Workshops approved by the HKMAAL/ the HKIAC since 2011 and Mediation Training in different social services agencies, governmental departments, commercial companies and educational institutes in HK and Macau since 2009. He was the vice-chairman of Family Mediation Interest Group of Hong Kong Mediation Council from 2012 to 2013.
